### Message from the Executive Director

We had a visit to Helmcken House from one of our funders recently and in our conversation we chatted about the vital role housing plays in HIV health and wellbeing. I was telling this funder about how last year one of our long- term residents passed away. During his illness he had a long-time friend stay with him and care for him. The friend "Mike" had nowhere to live when our resident passed away and so became homeless. "Mike" was always respectful to staff and residents and often came to chat with me about his life. He made a living by doing odd jobs for people as he did not want to be a burden on the system. All his money went to paying for hostel rooms which left little or no money for food. Often, he would come by the office for a chat and staff would make him breakfast.

As time went on, he became unable to pay for housing and he began to live on the street. As such, his physical health deteriorated and he became thin, gaunt and began to struggle with a chest infection which eventually led to a collapsed lung. Reluctantly, he ended up in St. Paul's where he was diagnosed with HIV. Once on medication and following their medical advice, his overall health rapidly improved. At the point of diagnosis, he had AIDS and his body was beginning to shut down.

Several months later as he left the hospital, he was interviewed by our team and was offered a unit at 1249 Howe in our supportive housing building. "Mike" enthusiastically moved in but was still determined not to be a burden on the system. A year later he is undetectable, which means he cannot infect anyone else, he is consistently taking his medication, has put on weight, and is on disability allowance. With support, he even filed 10 years of taxes!

I visited "Mike" last week. His unit is spotlessly clean and tidy and while I was visiting, he told me this is the first home he has had since he was a teenager some 30 years ago. When we first met him, he possessed only a few belongings, including a set of speakers which we had stored for him. Now those very speakers sit proudly in his home and play some fabulous music for "Mike" and his visitors. He is back to his old self, and often volunteers in the community kitchen at Howe Street. Bravo!

My hope is that in sharing this story with you, it truly highlights the very large impact that adequate housing has for those who are living with HIV/AIDS in our city and elsewhere. With your help, and in collaboration with the medical adherence and support offered to residents, McLaren Housing Society is truly saving lives. For that, we thank you.


#### 41st Annual Pride Parade

After being homeless for four months, I desperately dropped in to McLaren Housing's office (hoping not to look too scattered), to update my file. When I was asked for a phone number, I hesitated to say that I was in a shelter and homeless, but had no choice. Then the staff person turned to me and said "Can you come in for an interview? You are at the top of our wait list and we've been trying to contact you!" I started to cry because of the possibility of having a place to live. I had applied for housing a long time ago. I knew this would bring inner strength, clarity and peace for me. Being homeless has weakened my soul. No one should ever have to carry that burden of hopelessness. Now I have a goal, and feel more grounded, and centered, and most of all, to strengthen my inner self and feel part of society once again.
